Unit I Easter

Knowledge and Understanding of the World

EAD Music

Expressive Arts and Design:

In our topic Big Bear Funk, we will find a funky pulse, copy-clap 3 or 4 word phrases from songs, add pitched notes to the rhythm of the words or phrases of the song, we will enjoy playing patterns using C,D and E as well as discussing pitch and beat of a piece of music.

Phonics

We use *Little Wandle Letters and Sounds* to teach Phonics.

We will revise phase 3 and children will be taught to spell longer and compound words, as well s words with s in the middle and words ending in -ing, s and -es.

EAD Art DT

In art we will be inspired by Life in the Garden. We will paint different flowers from our observations, using finer brushes to add detail and describe their colours and features.

We will use flowers and leaves to create our own potions.

In DT we will create our own garden collage boxes and then make and contrast a rainforest box using card, coloured paper and natural materials collected from school grounds .We will create a large class picture of the rainforest as well as look at and create art in the style of Andy Goldsworthy.
