History

Twentieth Century Conflict

This term we will learn about the First World War and the causes of the Second World War. We will learn about Hitler's rise to power and what life was like for children during World War Two. To enhance and deepen our understanding of this significant period in World History, we will visit the **STEAM Railway Museum** in Swindon for their special "We'll Meet Again" wartime festival for schools where pupils will become immersed in the sounds and sights of the Home Front.

MAKE DO AND MEND All the learning is focussed around the song from Benjamin Britten's Friday Afternoons: A New Year Carol. Children will also have the opportunity to research Benjamin Britten's life and to listen to his other works
