

Autumn One in Year 1



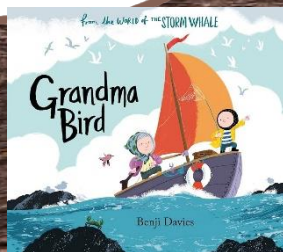
English

In English lessons we are going to use the fiction text 'The Tiger Who Came to Tea' as a stimulus to write a narrative retelling.

We will make cross-curricular links with Science to inform by writing a weather warning.

In Poetry we will explore 'The Stars' and 'Twinkle Twinkle Little Star' to help us come up with descriptive poetry. We will also be celebrating National Poetry Day with our very own

Homework

Homework is given out on a Thursday and due back the following Tuesday. It has an English or Maths focus relevant to the children's learning that week.

- Spellings - tests are on Fridays

- Reading - children's reading should be recorded in their reading journals daily

Phonics books and reading journals need to be in school each day.

Maths

Place Value: Sort and count objects, represent objects, recognise numbers as words, count on, 1 more, count backwards, 1 less, compare groups, fewer, more and the same, less than, greater than and equal to, compare numbers, order objects and numbers, the number line.

Addition and Subtraction: Introduce parts and wholes, the part-whole model, writing number sentences, fact families, number bonds, addition, finding a part, subtraction.

CLIC: Counting, Learn-its, It's Nothing New, Calculation (daily maths skills)

Science

The Human Body and Seasonal Changes

Pupils will identify and name parts of the human body and draw and labels parts of the human body. They will also look into sight, sound, taste, touch and smell. They will also look at the changes in autumn and collect and record date.

R.E

Unit 1A: Creation

This unit is designed to develop the children's appreciation of themselves and the world around them as part of God's Creation. It also helps the children to reflect on the need to thank and praise God for his many gifts.

Unit 1B: Families and Celebration

This unit is designed to develop the children's knowledge and understanding of what it means to belong to, and celebrate as, a family. The unit will focus on the Mass, the stories of the Presentation and Finding of Jesus in the Temple and the Wedding Feast at Cana as important celebrations in the life of the Church and Jesus.

Geography

Weather and Fieldwork Skills

We will be producing a weather report as part of our Geography learning. To help us do this we will be looking into what weather is, how we make decisions, what we need to find out, how we can use success criteria and data to help us and how we can present the decisions.

P.E

This term our PE days are Tuesdays and Fridays.

Team Building

In this unit pupils develop their teamwork skills. They work individually, in pairs and in small groups, learning to take turns, work collaboratively and lead each other. They develop key skills of communication and problem solving. They are given the opportunity to discuss and plan their ideas and reflect on their success.

Fitness

In this unit pupils develop their understanding of the benefits of exercise and a healthy lifestyle on their physical body, their mood and their overall health. They will work independently, in pairs and small groups to complete challenges in which they will sometimes need to persevere to achieve their personal best.

God Loves You

This session tells the story of 'The Prodigal Son' to show that God loves us, and nothing we can do will stop Him from loving us. Children will listen to an adapted version of 'The Prodigal Son' story and participate in activities and discussions to help them apply this story to their own lives.

Special People

This session will help children to identify the 'special people' in their lives and what makes them special. Through exploring Super Susie's network - her Super Special Squad - children will understand the importance of the nuclear and wider family, and of being close to and trusting their special people, especially their parents. They will also learn that it is important to talk to their special people about things that are troubling them. Children will be given opportunities to reflect on their own network of special people and to remember that their relationship with God is the most special of all.

Computing

Computing systems and networks – Technology around us

Learners will develop their understanding of technology and how it can help them in their everyday lives. They will start to become familiar with the different components of a computer by developing their keyboard and mouse skills. Learners will also consider how to use technology responsibly and who to ask for help if they see any content or comments online that make them feel uncomfortable.

Music
