
Science

Long Division: We will learn how to carry out the formal written method for dividing larger numbers by 2-digits.

Numbers up to 10,000,000: We will continue to deepen our understanding of larger numbers, through comparing, partitioning and rounding numbers. By the end of this unit, children will have the knowledge and confidence to Calculate with larger numbers, moving between mental and written methods.

Unit 6G: Prayers in the lives of the followers of Christ

In this unit, Children gain a greater knowledge and understanding of the traditional prayers of the Church and some of the signs and actions associated with prayer. <u>Unit 6C: Advent</u> Children will develop their understanding of the two parts of the Season of Advent. A time to prepare for Christ to come again and a time to prepare to celebrate his birth at Christmas.

Frozen Kingdoms

This term we will identify the geographical similarities and differences through the study of human and physical geography of the UK and the Arctic. We will deepen our learning by Carrying out independent research and asking and answering questions focussing on people, resources, natural and human environments, settlements and population. This will lead to exploring the reasons why polar biomes are under threat and children will be challenged to consider how we can persuade people to protect biomes.

Christmas Embroidered Gift

This term we will design and make an embroidered Christmas decoration to sell at our Christmas Fair.

We will compare evaluate existing products and consider our intended consumer, before making prototypes of our designs.

We will revisit and practice basic sewing and stitching skills before making our final product.
