

Glory Be

In this prayer, we praise the Holy Trinity: God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit.

> Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, as it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end.



<u>Prayer to my Guardian Angel</u>

God gave each one of us an angel to look after us. We cannot see him but we can pray to him. This is a prayer to your Guardian angel.

The Memomare

The Memomare is a prayer to help us remember how important and special Mary is to us in our lives.

Remember, O most loving Virgin Mary, that it is a thing unheard of, that anyone ever had recourse to your protection, implored your help, or sought your intercession, and was left forsaken. Filled therefore with confidence in your goodness I fly to you, O Mother, Virgin of virgins. To you I come, before you I stand, a sorrowful sinner. Despise not my poor words, O Mother of the Word of God, but graciously hear and grant my prayer. Amen

The Rosary

The Rosary is a prayer to Mary. It consists of 5 decades, each beginning with a short thought about one of the mysteries. In each decade we say 1 Our Father, 10 Hail Marys and 1 Glory Be. We can use the Rosary beads to help counting. There are 4 sets of Mysteries.

The Rosary

Sign of the Cross
Pray - Our Father, three Hail Marys and Glory be to the Father
Choose one of the mysteries:
Joyful, Sorrowful, Glorious or Illuminous....

The Joyful Mysteries

- The Annunciation
 The Archangel Gabriel announces' to Mary that she has been chosen to be the mother of Jesus, son of God.
- The Visitation
 Mary visits her cousin, Elizabeth, who is also pregnant –
 with John the Baptist. Elizabeth tells her that she will
 always be remembered.
- 3. The Nativity
 Jesus is born in a stable in Bethlehem.
- 4. The Presentation
 Mary and Joseph 'present' the infant Jesus in the Temple,
 to present him to God. They meet Simeon.
- 5. The Finding of Jesus in the Temple
 After losing Jesus, Mary and Joseph find him in the
 Temple discussing his faith and preaching to the Rabbis.

The Luminous Mysteries

- 1. The Baptism of Jesus in the River Jordan God proclaims that Jesus is his beloved Son.
- 2. The Wedding Feast at Cana At Mary's request, Jesus performs his first miracle, changing water in to wine.
- 3. The Proclamation of the Kingdom of God Jesus calls all to conversion (cf. Mark 1:15) and forgives the sins of all that draw near to him.
- 4. The Transfiguration of Jesus
 The glory of Godhead shines forth from the father from
 the face of Jesus, as he is revealed in glory to Peter,
 James, and John.
- 5. The Institution of the Eucharist
 Jesus offers his Body and Blood at the Last Supper, the
 first Mass, establishing the the sacramental foundation
 for all Christian lives.

The Sorrowful Mysteries

- The Agony in the Garden
 Jesus prays in the Garden of Gethsemane, sweating blood
 and water, on the night before his passion.
- 2. The Scourging at the Pillar Pilate has Jesus whipped.
- 3. The Crowning with Thorns

 Jesus is mocked by the Roamn soldiers and crowned with thorns.
- 4. The Carrying of the Cross

 Jesus carries the cross that will be used to crucify him,

falling three times. He meets Simon, the Ladies of Jerusalem and His mother.

5. The Crucifixion

Jesus is nailed to the cross and dies before His mother

and His apostle John.

The Glorious Mysteries

- The Resurrection
 Jesus rises from the dead on the third day.
- 2. The Ascension

 Jesus leaves the Apostles and bodily 'ascends' to his


 Father in heaven.
- 3. The Descent of the Holy Spirit
 The Apostles receive the Holy Spirit in tongues of fire
 whilst in the upper room. The Holy Spirit brings new life
 to the disciples.
- 4. The Assumption of Mary
 At the end of her life on earth, Mary is taken body and
 soul assumed into heaven.
- The Coronation of Mary Mary is crowned as Queen of Heaven and Earth.

Stations of the Cross

In the Stations of the Cross, we walk with Jesus carrying the cross to Mount Calvary. We think of what he went through when he suffered and died to save us from sin.

- 1. Jesus is condemned to death.
 - 2. Jesus accepts his cross.
- 3. Jesus falls for the first time.
 - 4. Jesus meets his mother
- 5. Simon helps carry the cross.
- 6. Veronica wipes the face of Jesus.
 - 7. Jesus falls for the second time.
 - 8. Jesus speaks to the women.
 - 9. Jesus falls for the third time.
- 10. Jesus stripped of his garments.
 - 11. Jesus is nailed to the cross.
 - 12. Jesus dies on the cross.
- 13. Jesus is taken down from the cross.
 - 14. Jesus is laid in the tomb.




<u>Prayer for Peace</u>
