

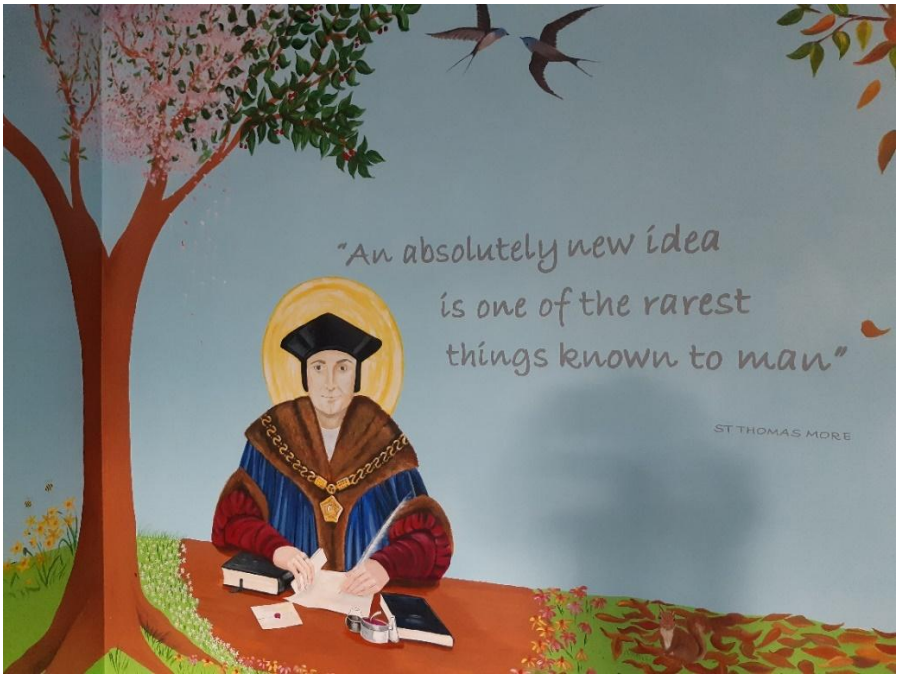

The Confiteor

This is another prayer we say to show God we are sorry. It is said during Mass.

I confess to almighty God
and to you my brothers and sisters,
that I have greatly sinned,
in my thoughts and in my words,
in what I have done and in what I have failed to do,
through my fault, through my fault, through my most grievous
fault;

therefore, I ask blessed Mary, ever-Virgin,
all the Angels and Saints,
and you, my brothers and sisters,
to pray for me to the Lord our God.

The Angelus

This prayer reminds us of when the Angel Gabriel was sent to Mary to tell her that she was going to have baby Jesus - the son of God. Some people say the Angelus three times a

The Angel of the Lord declared unto Mary:

And she conceived of the Holy Spirit.

Hail Mary, full of grace ...

Behold the handmaid of the Lord:

Be it done to me according to thy word.

Hail Mary, full of grace ...

And the Word was made flesh:

And dwelt among us.

Hail Mary, full of grace ...

Pray for us, O holy Mother of God.

That we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ.

Sign of the Cross

Pray - Our Father, three Hail Marys and Glory be to the Father

Choose one of the mysteries:

Joyful, Sorrowful, Glorious or Illuminous...

The Joyful Mysteries

1. *The Annunciation*
The Archangel Gabriel announces' to Mary that she has been chosen to be the mother of Jesus, son of God.
2. *The Visitation*
Mary visits her cousin, Elizabeth, who is also pregnant - with John the Baptist. Elizabeth tells her that she will always be remembered.
3. *The Nativity*
Jesus is born in a stable in Bethlehem.
4. *The Presentation*
Mary and Joseph 'present' the infant Jesus in the Temple, to present him to God. They meet Simeon.
5. *The Finding of Jesus in the Temple*
After losing Jesus, Mary and Joseph find him in the Temple discussing his faith and preaching to the Rabbis.

The Luminous Mysteries

1. *The Baptism of Jesus in the River Jordan*
God proclaims that Jesus is his beloved Son.
2. *The Wedding Feast at Cana*
At Mary's request, Jesus performs his first miracle, changing water in to wine.

3. *The Proclamation of the Kingdom of God*
Jesus calls all to conversion (cf. Mark 1:15) and forgives the sins of all that draw near to him.
4. *The Transfiguration of Jesus*
The glory of Godhead shines forth from the father from the face of Jesus, as he is revealed in glory to Peter, James, and John.
5. *The Institution of the Eucharist*
Jesus offers his Body and Blood at the Last Supper, the first Mass, establishing the the sacramental foundation for all Christian living

The Sorrowful Mysteries

1. *The Agony in the Garden*
Jesus prays in the Garden of Gethsemane, sweating blood and water, on the night before his passion.
2. *The Scourging at the Pillar*
Pilate has Jesus whipped.
3. *The Crowning with Thorns*
Jesus is mocked by the Roman soldiers and crowned with thorns.
4. *The Carrying of the Cross*
Jesus carries the cross that will be used to crucify him, falling three times. He meets Simon, the Ladies of Jerusalem and His mother.
5. *The Crucifixion*
Jesus is nailed to the cross and dies before His mother and His apostle John.

The Glorious Mysteries

1. *The Resurrection*
Jesus rises from the dead on the third day.
2. *The Ascension*
Jesus leaves the Apostles and bodily 'ascends' to his Father in heaven.
3. *The Descent of the Holy Spirit*
The Apostles receive the Holy Spirit in tongues of fire whilst in the upper room. The Holy Spirit brings new life to the disciples.
4. *The Assumption of Mary*
At the end of her life on earth, Mary is taken body and soul - assumed - into heaven.
5. *The Coronation of Mary*
Mary is crowned as Queen of Heaven and Earth.
