Maths

Money:

recognise and use symbols for pounds (£) and pence (p); combine amounts to make a particular value, find different combinations of coins that equal the same amounts of money, solve simple problems in a practical context involving addition and subtraction of money of the same unit, including giving change.

Fractions: Introduction to parts and whole, equal and unequal parts, recognise a half, recognise a quarter, find a quarter, recognise a third, find a third, find the whole, unit fractions, non-unit fractions, recognise the equivalent of half and two-quarters, recognise three-quarters, find three-quarters, count in fractions up to a whole.

Time: O' Clock and half past, quarter to and quarter past, tell the time past the hour and to the hour, tell the time to five minutes, minutes in an hour, and minutes in a day

This unit is designed to develop the children's knowledge and understanding of the stories of Easter from the New Testament and of the Symbols the church uses to celebrate the sacrament.

Science

Plants (Bulbs and Seeds)

Year 2 will have the opportunity to explore a wide range of plants. They will closely observe a diverse selection of plants, which can include flowering plants, fruit, vegetables and herbs. They will sort and group these plants using different criteria or categories. Children look at the best conditions for growth for seeds. They will be given the opportunity to observe the seeds in detail and make accurate observations using hand lenses. Children plan their investigation and determine what they will change and keep the same. They should also create a schedule for observations to ensure both plants are regularly monitored for any changes.

Growing Up

In this unit we will be exploring the adult and offspring of different animals. We will look at a range of lifecycles and compare the similarities and differences.

Art

3D Sculpture: Su Blackwell

Pupils will be able to describe and compare sculptures from the past and present and to know about the artist Su Blackwell and be able to describe some of her work. The pupils will be learning different skills like learning to fold paper accurately and with precision, to use paper to manipulate and sculpt paper to create different effects as well as to explore sculpting paper to create different shapes, such as birds, animals, flowers and trees. By the end of this unit the pupils will create an enchanted Fairy tale forest themed paper sculpture inspired by Su Blackwell.

Computing

Creating media - Digital music

Learners will explore how music can make them think and feel. They will make patterns and use those patterns to make music with both percussion instruments and digital tools. They will also create different rhythms and tunes, using the movement of animals for inspiration. Finally, learners will share their creations and compare creating music digitally and non-digitally.

PE

Net and Wall Games

In this unit, pupils develop their understanding of attacking and defending principles in net games such as using a ready position to defend their court and placement of a ball into space. They use and develop skills such as throwing, catching, tracking and hitting a ball. They learn how to score points and how to play to the rules. They work independently, with a partner and in a small group and begin to self-manage their own games, showing respect and kindness towards their teammates and opponents.

Gymnastics

In this unit pupils learn, explore and develop basic gymnastic actions on the floor and using apparatus. They develop gymnastic skills of jumping, rolling, balancing and travelling individually and in combination to create short sequences and movement phrases.
