

Summer Two Term Year 6

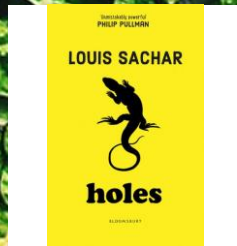


English

Maths

This term we will focus on consolidation, problem solving and themed projects. These projects will provide an opportunity to revisit many of the skills and curriculum content covered both in Year 6 and the rest of Key Stage 2. The projects have been designed to explore maths in real life contexts, allowing children to see how important maths is in all aspects of life.

Geography

This term, pupils will learn about the concept of Globalisation. Links will be made with History as we explore how technology and fashion has changed over time and effected the way we communicate. Children will learn about global trade before debating whether globalisation has made the world a better place. Children will carry out an independent project using the chrome books to research and present their findings to showcase their learning in this unit.

Unit 6J: Pentecost:

Children will learn about two stories from the New Testament about the coming of the Holy Spirit. Through their study of the Sacrament of Confirmation, they will learn about the Gifts and Fruits of the Holy Spirit and how they are important in the lives of Christians.

Unit 6: K Belonging to the Church Community

Unit 6L: Celebrating the lives of Mary and the Saints:

In this unit we explore some of the Church's beliefs about the Blessed Virgin Mary and the feasts that are celebrated for her. The children will consider why her role in the life of Christ was so important.

Science

Variation and Adaptations

Children will learn about inherited and environmental variation and that variation helps species survive. They will also understand that adaptations are features or behaviours that help plants and animals survive in their habitat and will explore some of these in detail.

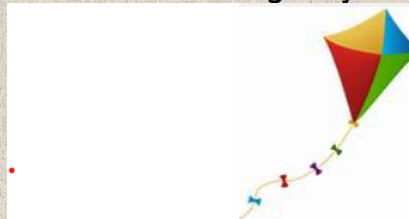
Fossils

PE

Rounders

Pupils will develop their throwing and catching under pressure. They will practise bowling and develop fielding techniques and tactics. Children will have opportunities to apply their skills in competitive games.

Athletics

This term, pupils will improve their sprinting techniques. They practise the triple jump and develop power and control and technique when throwing for a distance.
